GUEST SPEAKER

PROFESSOR JO PRITCHARD, OBE CEREMONY C

Jo undertook her nurse training at the University of Surrey and then specialised in intensive care and then public health nursing. She has worked across most areas of the NHS as a nurse, senior manager and leader.

In 2006, Jo was instrumental in establishing the first employee-owned social enterprise to come out of the NHS in England; she led the not for profit sharing organisation for eleven years.

This paved the way for a national strategy encouraging the development of social businesses and employee ownership. In 2011 Jo was invited by the then Secretary of State for the Cabinet Office to join the Mutuals' Taskforce to create opportunities for employee ownership within the public sector.

Appointed as a Commissioner on the Prime Minister's Nursing and Midwifery Commission in 2010, the following year she was awarded an MBE for services to social enterprise. In 2017 Jo was honoured with the Employee Ownership Association's Philip Baxendale Fellowship award and later that year was made an Honorary Fellow of Social Enterprise UK. She was awarded an OBE in 2021 for services to health and social care.

Jo has a particular interest in nurse leadership, health policy and in supporting social entrepreneurs. She is Chair of the Foundation of Nursing Studies, a Non Executive director at Social Enterprise UK and is a Visiting Professor at the University of Surrey.



GUEST SPEAKER

DAVID EBSWORTH - CEREMONY D

Dr David Ebsworth started his career as a sales representative for Pfizer in Germany. He subsequently headed the worldwide Pharmaceutical Business for Bayer and was CEO of Oxford Glycosciences, Vifor Pharma and Galenica.

He is currently chairman of Verona Pharma, a company focused on respiratory diseases such as COPD which recently successfully launched Ohtuvayre following FDA approval. Dr. Ebsworth is also Chairman of Synlab AG, Actimed Therapeutics and Opterion Health.

Dr. Ebsworth has a cross-cultural background, born in Nigeria, the son of a British soldier, he lived in the UK, Germany and Singapore all before he was 9 years old. In his career he has worked in the UK, Germany, Canada, the United States, Romania and Switzerland.

Dr. Ebsworth is an alumnus of Surrey, awarded a B.Sc. First Class Honours in Chemistry and German and a Ph.D. in Comparative Industrial Relations. In 2015 David was made a Visiting Professor at the Surrey Business School.



A LITTLE HISTORY

NEARLY 60 YEARS OF SURREY DEGREES

The University of Surrey was established on 9 September 1966 with the grant of its Royal Charter, but its roots go back to 1891, when its forerunner Battersea Polytechnic Institute was founded to teach poorer London inhabitants. As its academic reputation grew, the renamed Battersea College of Technology moved to Guildford in the 1960s, where it became a university awarding its own degrees.

Since July 1970, by kind permission of the Dean and Chapter, degree conferment ceremonies have been held in Guildford Cathedral. On these occasions it is used as a secular building.




The mace

The University mace was designed and crafted by Desmond Clen Murphy and used ceremonially for the first time at the Installation as Chancellor of the Rt Hon the Lord Robens of Woldingham in 1966.

The mace is made of silver and walnut wood, with the shield of the University coat of arms on its head in colour, and with the shields of the coat of arms of Surrey County Council, Guildford Borough Council and Battersea Polytechnic Institute engraved in silver underneath. The embroidered coat of arms on the mace table, carried out in metallic thread, French knots, applied leathers and various materials, was created by Christine Habib, a former student of the Hampton School of Embroidery.

The mace was presented to Guildford Cathedral for permanent display on 13 July 1997.



The arms of the University of Surrey

The University of Surrey coat of arms commemorates the University's move from London to Guildford. The woolpacks on the shield are taken from the arms of the Borough of Guildford, while the blue and gold chequers and mantling are from the arms of the former Earls of Surrey. The swords, an allusion to the arms of the City of London, are taken from the shield of Battersea Polytechnic.

The blazon of the University's coat of arms, which was granted in 1966, is topped by a stag resting its right leg on an upturned key. The stag denotes the medieval royal hunting park on which our leafy Stag Hill site has been developed, while the key is a heraldic symbol of learning.

The coat of arms is an elegant symbol of our reputation and standing.

ACADEMIC DRESS

Every university has a distinctive set of academic robes for the degrees it awards and special ceremonial robes for the high officers of the university. The blue brocade that features in the hoods of all our robes is unique to Surrey and distinguishes us from other universities.

GRADUATE ROBES

Undergraduate and masters degrees

Graduates wear a black gown and a black cloth mortar board. Hoods are usually fully lined with blue brocade and vary in design depending on whether the award is undergraduate or postgraduate.



Diploma and certificate awards

Diplomates wear a black gown and a black cloth mortar board. Postgraduate hoods are fully lined with blue brocade, with a plain white trim. Undergraduate hoods have a blue brocade and plain white trim.



Doctorate awards

Gowns are in cardinal red with blue brocade on the front facings. The hoods are cardinal red, fully lined with University brocade and have a ribbon trim rebated from the outside edge of the hood. The hat is a black cloth bonnet with red cord and tassels, with the exception of Doctors of Letters, Science and Medicine where the cord and tassels are gold.

The colour of the trim on the hoods denotes the type of degree:

- Bachelor and Master of Arts, Doctor of Letters** - Red ribbon
- Bachelor, Master and Doctor of Education** - Green ribbon
- Bachelor, Master and Doctor of Engineering** - Grey ribbon
- Bachelor and Master of Laws** - Purple ribbon
- Bachelor and Master of Music** - White brocade
- Bachelor, Master and Doctor of Science** - No trim
- Bachelor of Veterinary Medicine** - Pale yellow ribbon
- Master of Business** - Ruby ribbon
- Master of Chemistry / of Computing / of Mathematics / in Physics / in Science (MSci)** - Pale blue ribbon

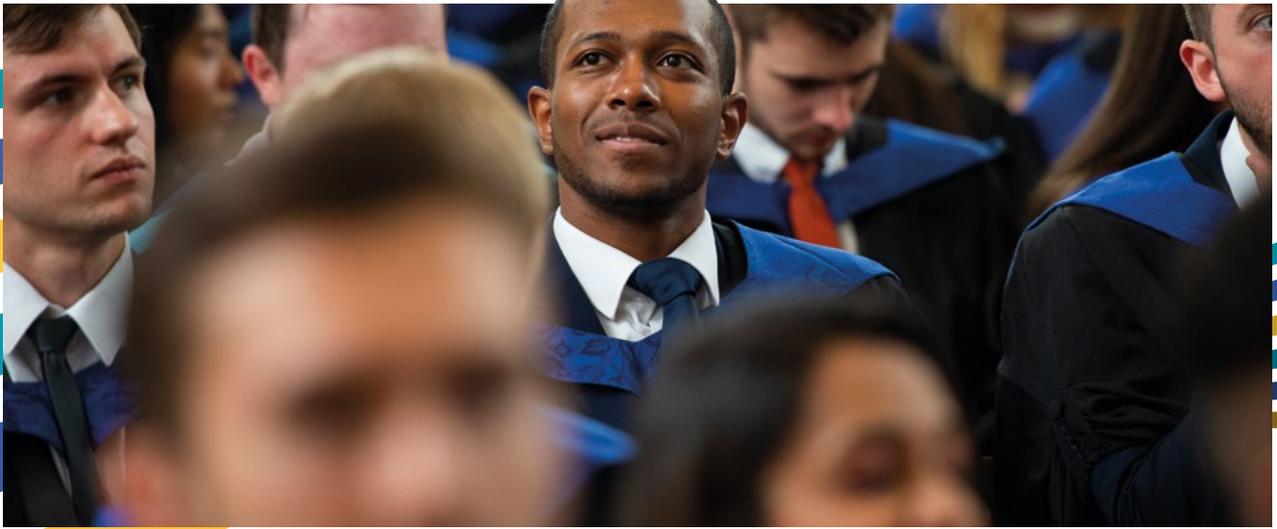
