## GUEST SPEAKER

### PROFESSOR VINCENT WALSH – CEREMONY I

Professor Vincent Walsh is Emeritus Professor of Human Brain Research at the Institute of Cognitive Neuroscience, University College London, where he leads the Applied Cognitive Neuroscience group. His research focuses on understanding human brain function, particularly in the areas of sleep, learning, and decision making. He is widely recognised for his pioneering work in transcranial magnetic stimulation (TMS) and the application of neuroscience to real-world contexts including elite sports.

Professor Walsh has published extensively, authoring over 300 research papers and several influential books, including *Transcranial Magnetic Stimulation: A Neurochronometrics of Mind*. His work has been cited more than 43,000 times, reflecting the breadth and impact of his contributions to neuroscience.

In addition to his academic work, Professor Walsh has a strong interest in the practical applications of brain science. He has collaborated with a wide range of organisations – from elite sports teams such as Team GB, Premier League Football clubs, and the Rugby Football Union, to industries including pharmaceuticals and design – to apply cognitive neuroscience in enhancing human performance.

A highly regarded science communicator, he has delivered public lectures across the UK, appeared on BBC Radio 4 and The One Show, and contributed to outlets such as *New Scientist*. He also regularly speaks at science festivals and leadership events, focusing on creativity, pressure, and performance.

Previously a Royal Society University Research Fellow and based at the University of Oxford, Professor Walsh is committed to mentoring early career researchers and supporting innovation within the scientific community.



## GUEST SPEAKER

### PROFESSOR JAMIE WATERALL – CEREMONY J

Professor Jamie Waterall is a leading figure in public health nursing and currently serves as Deputy Chief Public Health Nurse for England within the Office for Health Improvement and Disparities at the Department of Health and Social Care. He is responsible for shaping workforce strategy and leading national prevention-focused programmes.

Since qualifying as a nurse in 1999, Professor Waterall has held a range of roles across local, regional, national and international settings. He has led key initiatives such as the NHS Health Check, cardiovascular disease prevention, the Family Nurse Partnership, and the Healthy Child Programme. He also oversees All Our Health, a professional platform aimed at equipping

the health and care workforce to promote prevention, reduce inequalities, and support wellbeing.

He holds honorary professorships at both the University of Nottingham and the University of Hull, and was awarded an Honorary Doctor of Science by Hull in 2025 in recognition of his contribution to public health and education.

Professor Waterall has published extensively on topics including cardiovascular health, health inequalities, and public health nursing. A passionate advocate for health improvement, he encourages the nursing profession to take bold leadership roles in shaping policy, education and community health for a healthier future.



## GUEST SPEAKER

### PROFESSOR CELIA MARR – CEREMONY K

Professor Celia Marr BVMS, MVM, PhD, DEIM, DipECEIM, FRCVS is a leading specialist in equine internal medicine, currently based at Rosssdales Equine Hospital and Diagnostic Centre in Newmarket. She graduated from the University of Glasgow in 1985, where she also completed both an MVM and a PhD, before being awarded a Fulbright Scholarship to undertake advanced training in equine cardiology and internal medicine at the University of Pennsylvania.

Her clinical expertise includes cardiovascular medicine, critical care, internal medicine, and diagnostic imaging. Over the course of her distinguished career, she has held senior posts at the Royal Veterinary College, the University

of Cambridge, and in leading racehorse practices in Lambourn. She joined Rosssdales in 2003 and is widely recognised for her pioneering work in equine cardiology, particularly in the diagnosis and management of arrhythmias.

Professor Marr is a Diplomate of the European College of Equine Internal Medicine, a Fellow of the Royal College of Veterinary Surgeons, and an Honorary Professor at the University of Glasgow. She is Editor-in-Chief of the Equine Veterinary Journal, and serves on a number of national advisory bodies including the British Equestrian Equine Infectious Disease Advisory Group and the Horserace Betting Levy Board.



## GUEST SPEAKER

### PROFESSOR FAITH GIBSON – CEREMONY L

Faith Gibson is Director for Research-Nursing and Allied Health and Professor of Child Health and Cancer Care at Great Ormond Street Hospital for Children (GOSH). At GOSH she also leads a research centre. The Centre for Outcomes and Experience Research in Children's Health, Illness and Disability (ORCHID). She first joined the clinical cancer team at GOSH in 1986, and she has been at the hospital since then, in a number of different clinical, educational and research roles. From 2016-2024 she has held a joint appointment with the University of Surrey, she now holds the position of Professor Emeritus.

Faith is a nurse, a children's cancer nurse, and now a researcher with a programme of research focused on children and young people's cancer care. Her acclaimed work in this field has led to a fellowship with the Royal College of Nursing, a Life-Time Achievement Award from the International Society of Pediatric Oncology (SIOP),

being made a Fellow of the American Academy of Nursing, and more recently awarded a Life-Time Achievement Award from the Children & Young People's Cancer Association.

Professor Gibson's research programme aims to improve the experience for children and young people, receiving and post cancer therapies (and their family members). There are five strands to her programme that focuses on understanding and improving: processes and outcomes of care for children/young people with cancer and their families; assessment and management of symptoms and development of clinical guidelines; survivorship care; the skills of the nursing workforce to deliver cancer care; and the experiences of children, young people, and young adults in hospital. She is a narrative researcher, drawing upon both qualitative and participatory research methods, and known in particular for her research with young children.



# HONORARY GRADUAND

## DR JULIE LLEWELYN – CEREMONY M

Dr Julie Llewelyn is a medical doctor and philanthropist. She was the first person in her family to attend University, graduating from Bristol in 1984. Dr Llewelyn worked as an NHS hospital doctor and has specialised in research and clinical work to help people living with diabetes, including the development of new insulins and advising the World Health Organisation on National Diabetes Programmes. She is currently a member of the Surrey Heartlands Integrated Care Partnership, which aims to improve health and wellbeing outcomes through community-based initiatives.

Dr Llewelyn was the 800th High Sheriff of Surrey in 2021-22 and the tenth woman to hold the position. Her theme was preventing permanent school exclusion and improving mental wellbeing in young people. She collaborated with the Royal Holloway University of London to produce a new evidence-based research initiative and then organised two summits, which brought together key stakeholders from Surrey's schools, charities and the police force for the first time. The project made lasting, systematic change and improved alternative learning provision across the county.

Dr Llewelyn has worked with a variety of local and national charities over the last 20 years. She was Vice-Chair of the Community Foundation of Surrey (2017-23) and is now a Vice-President, where she focuses on bringing charitable organisations together to achieve maximum impact. She has previously been a member of the Diabetes UK Council of Healthcare Professionals, advising on national health policy and NICE approvals, represented the voluntary sector on the Surrey County Council One Surrey Growth Board, and served as a member of the Development Board for Hospice UK. She is particularly interested in working with young people and is a Patron of Surrey Care Trust and Emerge Advocacy and a member of the Council of the Royal Albert and Alexander School.

Dr Llewelyn has been a Deputy Lieutenant of Surrey since 2023 and is Chair of the Lieutenancy Charities and Communities Focus group. She lives in Surrey with her family and is a strong believer in working to help improve the lives of those around you.



# HONORARY GRADUAND

## PROFESSOR STEPHEN LANGLEY – CEREMONY N

Professor Stephen Langley is a leading figure in the field of urological oncology and is internationally recognised for his pioneering work in the diagnosis and treatment of prostate cancer. He currently serves as Professor of Urology and Consultant Urological Surgeon at the Royal Surrey NHS Foundation Trust and the University of Surrey, where he has helped to establish one of the UK's foremost centres for prostate cancer.

After qualifying in medicine from St Bartholomew's Hospital Medical School in London, Professor Langley undertook specialist training in urology in the UK and USA and subsequently developed a clinical and research interest in prostate cancer.

He was among the first surgeons in the UK to introduce prostate brachytherapy, a technique to treat prostate cancer using tiny radioactive seeds which are implanted into the prostate gland. His subsequent technical developments in brachytherapy have improved the outcomes for many thousands of men he has personally treated and his techniques have been adopted world-wide. He also devised the technique of transperineal prostate biopsy, now considered

the NHS gold standard diagnostic method for detecting prostate cancer. He has played a major role in shaping national guidelines and training in these techniques. Most recently he has undertaken the UK's first prostate cancer screening programme, the results of which will help change national policy.

His academic contributions include numerous peer-reviewed publications and invited lectures at national and international conferences. Professor Langley is also a passionate educator and mentor, dedicated to training the next generation of urologists through his leadership in postgraduate education.

Committed to patient-centred care, in 2018 he opened a state of the art Urology Centre at the Royal Surrey which he both conceived and helped design. He drove a £6m fund raising campaign to build this Centre working with the Prostate Project Charity and the NHS; the Centre won the 2020 RICS Healthcare Building of the year award. Professor Langley's work has made a significant and lasting impact in the field of urological oncology, both in the UK and internationally.



## A LITTLE HISTORY

# NEARLY 60 YEARS OF SURREY DEGREES

The University of Surrey was established on 9 September 1966 with the grant of its Royal Charter, but its roots go back to 1891, when its forerunner Battersea Polytechnic Institute was founded to teach poorer London inhabitants. As its academic reputation grew, the renamed Battersea College of Technology moved to Guildford in the 1960s, where it became a university awarding its own degrees.

Since July 1970, by kind permission of the Dean and Chapter, degree conferment ceremonies have been held in Guildford Cathedral. On these occasions it is used as a secular building.



### The mace

The University mace was designed and crafted by Desmond Clen Murphy and used ceremonially for the first time at the Installation as Chancellor of the Rt Hon the Lord Robens of Woldingham in 1966.

The mace is made of silver and walnut wood, with the shield of the University coat of arms on its head in colour, and with the shields of the coat of arms of Surrey County Council, Guildford Borough Council and Battersea Polytechnic Institute engraved in silver underneath. The embroidered coat of arms on the mace table, carried out in metallic thread, French knots, applied leathers and various materials, was created by Christine Habib, a former student of the Hampton School of Embroidery.

The mace was presented to Guildford Cathedral for permanent display on 13 July 1997.



### The arms of the University of Surrey

The University of Surrey coat of arms commemorates the University's move from London to Guildford. The woolpacks on the shield are taken from the arms of the Borough of Guildford, while the blue and gold chequers and mantling are from the arms of the former Earls of Surrey. The swords, an allusion to the arms of the City of London, are taken from the shield of Battersea Polytechnic.

The blazon of the University's coat of arms, which was granted in 1966, is topped by a stag resting its right leg on an upturned key. The stag denotes the medieval royal hunting park on which our leafy Stag Hill site has been developed, while the key is a heraldic symbol of learning.

The coat of arms is an elegant symbol of our reputation and standing.

# ACADEMIC DRESS

Every university has a distinctive set of academic robes for the degrees it awards and special ceremonial robes for the high officers of the university. The blue brocade that features in the hoods of all our robes is unique to Surrey and distinguishes us from other universities.

## GRADUATE ROBES

### Undergraduate and masters degrees

Graduates wear a black gown and a black cloth mortar board. Hoods are usually fully lined with blue brocade and vary in design depending on whether the award is undergraduate or postgraduate.



### Diploma and certificate awards

Diplomates wear a black gown and a black cloth mortar board. Postgraduate hoods are fully lined with blue brocade, with a plain white trim. Undergraduate hoods have a blue brocade and plain white trim.



### Doctorate awards

Gowns are in cardinal red with blue brocade on the front facings. The hoods are cardinal red, fully lined with University brocade and have a ribbon trim rebated from the outside edge of the hood. The hat is a black cloth bonnet with red cord and tassels, with the exception of Doctors of Letters, Science and Medicine where the cord and tassels are gold.

The colour of the trim on the hoods denotes the type of degree:

- Bachelor and Master of Arts, Doctor of Letters** - Red ribbon
- Bachelor, Master and Doctor of Education** - Green ribbon
- Bachelor, Master and Doctor of Engineering** - Grey ribbon
- Bachelor and Master of Laws** - Purple ribbon
- Bachelor and Master of Music** - White brocade
- Bachelor, Master and Doctor of Science** - No trim
- Bachelor of Veterinary Medicine** - Pale yellow ribbon
- Master of Business** - Ruby ribbon
- Master of Chemistry / of Computing / of Mathematics / in Physics / in Science (MSci)** - Pale blue ribbon




