HONORARY GRADUAND

EBONY-JEWEL RAINFORD-BRENT MBE - CEREMONY K

A talented all-rounder, Ebony was part of the squad that won the 2009 ICC Women's Cricket World Cup and the 2009 ICC Women's T20 World Cup.

After retiring from professional cricket, Ebony transitioned into a successful broadcasting career, becoming a prominent voice on BBC Sport, Sky Sports, TNT, and Test Match Special. Additionally, Ebony hosted The Women's Sport Show on BBC Radio London until 2023.

She's been a leading figure in promoting inclusivity in cricket, co-founding the ACE Programme, which aims to increase opportunities for young Black cricketers in the UK.

Ebony published her debut book in 2025, Test Match Special: How To Read Cricket. This book offers an entertaining and witty guide to everything from amazing stats and skills analysis to the game's uniquely joyous culture, its stand-out players, greatest grounds and dodgiest pitches.

Ebony has worked with brands including Galaxy, Acitmel, Toyota, Sage, and Spotify.



GUEST SPEAKER

PROFESSOR JONATHAN HEENEY - CEREMONY L

Professor Jonathan Heeney is a veterinary pathologist, Fellow of the Royal College of Veterinary Surgeons, Professor of Comparative Pathology, Head of the Laboratory of Viral Zoonotics in the Department of Veterinary Medicine, and Fellow of Darwin College at the University of Cambridge.

His career in veterinary medicine and biomedical research spans North America, Europe, Africa and Asia, with major contributions to the principles of One Health through studies of human and animal diseases and the development of innovative vaccines.

After graduating from Ontario Veterinary College and later earning his Doctor of Veterinary Medicine degree, he completed advanced graduate training in pathology at the University of Guelph and a PhD in viral immunopathology at the US National Institutes of Health, followed by a Fellowship in Human Pathology at Stanford University School of Medicine.

Professor Heeney's research has focused on viral zoonoses, emerging infectious diseases and the interface between animal and human health, including work on hepatitis viruses in endangered orangutans, simian immunodeficiency viruses in chimpanzees and other primates, and high-consequence zoonotic pathogens such as Ebola and Lassa fever.

At the University of Cambridge, he leads research on pathogen discovery, comparative immunology and next-generation vaccine design. He is internationally recognised for pioneering approaches to vaccine development, including computational and synthetic biology methods to design broadly protective, future proof vaccines and novel platforms for pandemic preparedness.



GUEST SPEAKER

ARUNA MEHTA - CEREMONY M

Aruna Mehta was appointed Chair of Surrey and Borders Partnership NHS Foundation Trust in April 2024 for a three-year term, bringing extensive board-level experience as both an executive and non-executive, with particular expertise in governance.

She spent 25 years in banking and finance, leading global risk and control functions and developing strong expertise in governance, risk and compliance frameworks. She was Managing Director and Global Head of Operational Controls at JP Morgan and is now a Senior Associate at The Value Circle, supporting organisations with governance, leadership and strategy development across a range of sectors.

With over a decade of non-executive experience, Aruna has worked across healthcare, housing and education. Her NHS roles have included non-executive director positions at the Tavistock and Portman NHS Foundation Trust and St George's, Epsom and St Helier Hospital Group.

Alongside her role at Surrey and Borders, she served as interim Chair of the Tavistock and Portman NHS Foundation Trust from December 2025 to April 2026, supporting the merger with North London Foundation Trust.

Born in Sri Lanka and educated in India and the UK, Aruna holds a first-class BSc in Physics and Computer Science from King's College London and received the Commonwealth Science Prize.



GUEST SPEAKER

DR MARTIN WHITING - CEREMONY N

Dr. Martin Whiting is a board-certified specialist veterinarian awarded Fellowship to the RCVS for his meritorious contribution to the profession in veterinary law and ethics. With a PhD in veterinary law and a master's in medical ethics, he has published papers and textbooks and spoken internationally in these fields.

After time in practice, Dr. Whiting was appointed as the first faculty in Veterinary Ethics and Law at the Royal Veterinary College. He transitioned to the UK Civil Service (Home Office), where he served as Director of Operations in Science and Security regulating animal science. Subsequently, as Director of Education at CVS Group, he led the new graduate program and established a new veterinary nursing school.

In his current role as Global Head of Ethics and Welfare at Mars Inc., Dr. Whiting is accountable for the company's commitment to animal welfare, spanning all facets of the business, from ensuring the highest standards of veterinary care and ethical research and ingredient supply chain to promoting responsible pet ownership.

Since 2010, Dr. Whiting has held governance roles within the RCVS, including the Legislative Reform, Disciplinary and Education committees and chairing the PQSC which accredits the veterinary universities. He currently serves as Treasurer and Director of the European College of Animal Welfare and Behaviour Medicine.



A LITTLE HISTORY

60 YEARS OF SURREY DEGREES

The University of Surrey was established on 9 September 1966 with the grant of its Royal Charter, but its roots go back to 1891, when its forerunner, Battersea Polytechnic Institute, was founded.

As its academic reputation grew, it was renamed Battersea College of Technology and moved to Guildford in the 1960s, where it became a university awarding its own degrees.

And degree conferment ceremonies like yours have been held at Guildford Cathedral since 1970.

The mace

The University mace was designed and crafted by Desmond Clen Murphy and used ceremonially for the first time at the Installation as Chancellor of the Rt Hon the Lord Robens of Woldingham in 1966.

The mace is made of silver and walnut wood, with the shield of the University coat of arms on its head in colour, and with the shields of the coat of arms of Surrey County Council, Guildford Borough Council and Battersea Polytechnic Institute engraved in silver underneath. The embroidered coat of arms on the mace table, carried out in metallic thread, French knots, applied leathers and various materials, was created by Christine Habib, a former student of the Hampton School of Embroidery.

The mace was presented to Guildford Cathedral for permanent display on 13 July 1997.



The arms of the University of Surrey

The University of Surrey coat of arms commemorates the University's move from London to Guildford. The woolpacks on the shield are taken from the arms of the Borough of Guildford, while the blue and gold chequers and mantling are from the arms of the former Earls of Surrey. The swords, an allusion to the arms of the City of London, are taken from the shield of Battersea Polytechnic.

The blazon of the University's coat of arms, which was granted in 1966, is topped by a stag resting its right leg on an upturned key. The stag denotes the medieval royal hunting park on which our leafy Stag Hill site has been developed, while the key is a heraldic symbol of learning.

The coat of arms is an elegant symbol of our reputation and standing.

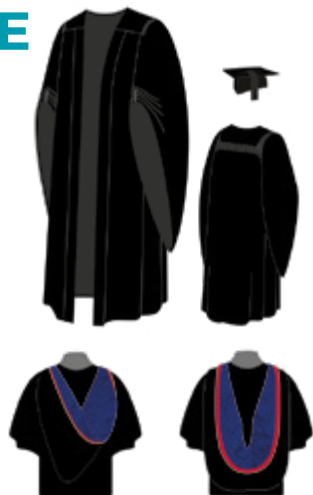
ACADEMIC DRESS

Every university has a distinctive set of academic robes for the degrees it awards and special ceremonial robes for the high officers of the university. The blue brocade that features in the hoods of all our robes is unique to Surrey and distinguishes us from other universities.

GRADUATE ROBES

Undergraduate and masters degrees

Graduates wear a black gown and a black cloth mortar board. Hoods are usually fully lined with blue brocade and vary in design depending on whether the award is undergraduate or postgraduate.



Diploma and certificate awards

Diplomates wear a black gown and a black cloth mortar board. Postgraduate hoods are fully lined with blue brocade, with a plain white trim. Undergraduate hoods have a blue brocade and plain white trim.



Doctorate awards

Gowns are in cardinal red with blue brocade on the front facings. The hoods are cardinal red, fully lined with University brocade and have a ribbon trim rebated from the outside edge of the hood. The hat is a black cloth bonnet with red cord and tassels, with the exception of Doctors of Letters, Science and Medicine where the cord and tassels are gold.

The colour of the trim on the hoods denotes the type of degree:

Bachelor and Master of Arts, Doctor of Letters - Red ribbon

Bachelor, Master and Doctor of Education - Green ribbon

Bachelor, Master and Doctor of Engineering - Grey ribbon

Bachelor and Master of Laws - Purple ribbon

Bachelor and Master of Music - White brocade

Bachelor and Master of Science - Pink ribbon

Bachelor of Veterinary Medicine - Pale yellow ribbon

Master of Business - Ruby ribbon

Master of Chemistry / of Computing / of Mathematics / in Physics / in Science (MSci) - Pale blue ribbon

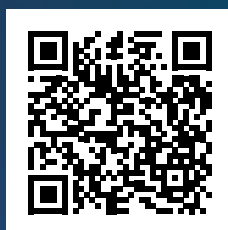
